





Questions


Sometimes when I'm in school, I daydream.






Next, I ran to my bed and jumped in. I pulled the covers over my head. The sheets were SO soft! Then, I heard my brother coming again.

Dad asks if I want the drink he bought. I'm very thirsty, so I take a long sip. Wow! The drink


has a very sour
